STATEMENT OF PRESIDENT MACRON CONDEMNING THE VIOLENCE IN VENEZUELA

ANTI GOVERNMENT PROTESTS LED TO A CRISIS

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USPA NEWS - Tension in Venezuela is on the rise again as the opposition and the government accuse each other of trying to stage a coup.

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The antigovernment protests in Venezuela, created a situation of violence and people killed since April. The French President Macron addressed a statement to condemn these violences. "France deplored the situation in Venezuela and condemned the violence, which had worsened in the last few days and again had many victims. The arrest of Leopoldo Lopez and Antonio Ledezma on Tuesday 1 August is a very negative signal in this respect. It marks a new stage in the confrontation and is not likely to facilitate the restoration of confidence." [?] The French President recalls the concern of other European Countries "Our European partners share these concerns, which were expressed by the High Representative, Ms Mogherini. Together we call for de-escalation, respect for human rights, the rule of law and fundamental freedoms. We look forward to a return to normal functioning of the institutions as soon as possible."
