The Internet Economy Faces Increased Risks of Cyber Attacks

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USPA NEWS - Despite the annual increase in the Internet economy, also known as "The Digital Economy" around the world; the Middle East and North Africa face more significant challenges related to securing information and infrastructure from cyber-attacks by hackers focused on sabotaging, extorting, or defrauding their victims.

Within this context, the annual MENA Information Security Conference 2017, being held on November 21st in Riyadh under the patronage of VirtuPort with lead sponsor Saudi Telecom Company - Solutions, it will be attended by leading international companies specializing in information technology and cyber security.

"The Internet economy is facing increased risk of financial loss, business interruption or theft of identities and intellectual property by the hackers which will create real issues with the increase of devices connecting to the Internet, especially in light of the economic growth of the Internet of Things or IoT," Samer Omar said, CEO of VirtuPort.

The forthcoming conference in Riyadh on information security will discuss a series of important topics that will provide an overview of the nature of cyber threats and solutions to reduce them. "The growing misuse of electronic networks for criminal purposes negatively affects the integrity of sensitive national information infrastructures, personal information, and government, service and financial sectors."

"Cybersecurity has become an essential part of any national security policy, and developed countries such as the United States and the European Union have categorized cybersecurity and cybersecurity issues as a priority in their national defense policies" he said.

The CEO of the Saudi Telecom group, Dr. Khaled Al- Biyari, will deliver a welcoming speech in the conference, during which, he will be highlighting the importance of expert discussion of cyber threats across the region.

Speech Topics

The Keynote speaker, Tom Ridge, is the former governor of Pennsylvania and the first secretary of the US Department of Homeland Security ever since it was founded on November 25, 2002. He will present the conference with a speech on "Business Flexibility in the Age of Overlying Cyber "Threats" and is expected to provide a different view of the nature of the attacks and the means of defense that enable the stakeholders to address them effectively and systematically.

For his part, the Vice President of Cyber "Security at Saudi Telecom Company - Solutions, Fahd Al-Jutaily, will present a working paper entitled "Intelligence Defense Systems: The Next Generation of SOC". Other topics being presented at the conference will also include the "Implications of Distributed Denial of Service (DDOS attack)" "Effective Security Services", as well as "Managed Security Services", "Vision 2030 and Cybersecurity".

The Information Security Conference is aligned with the Vision 2030 and the National Transition 2020 Program, which aims to

promote an advanced society in the technology sector. Moreover, it aspires to enhance the opportunities for top leaders and thinkers to meet in the field of electronic information security in the Kingdom.
