APF PUBLISHED A UNIQUE SURVEY WITH IFOP POLLS ABOUT DISABILITY AND VOTING INTENT

5000 RESPONDENTS ON VOTES 2017

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USPA NEWS - APF-Ifop, published the results of an unprecedented survey involving nearly 5,000 respondents, on the living conditions, aspirations and voting intentions of persons affected by disability. 92% of people with disabilities and 80% of the general public do not have confidence in politicians.

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The latter are sometimes presented as a "weight for society"! And the APF wishes to highlight the electoral weight represented by people with disabilities and their families, as 1 in 5 people in France is affected by disability!

With its "Elections 2017 and Disability" survey carried out by Ifop, the APF provides an overview of the living conditions, aspirations and voting intentions of those affected by disability.

“ç 79% of people with disabilities report difficulty with the resources of their households.

“ç 92% of people with disabilities and 80% of the general public do not have confidence in politicians so that the difficulties of people with disabilities are better taken into account in society.

“ç 94% of people with disabilities and 87% of the general public feel that disability is not sufficiently important in the countryside
