After the attack last night in Manchester, all Europe, free Europe was attacked, it was the European and British youth that was attacked in his heart. I had the opportunity a few hours ago to talk with Theresa May and I expressed her feelings. It is therefore above all the condolences, the feeling of solidarity and the full support that we had this afternoon to express. It is also our desire to strengthen European cooperation in the fight against terrorism. The next few hours will tell us what was the identity and the path of the terrorist or the terrorists if it is proved that accomplices were present. We will be determined and resolved alongside all our European partners to fight against terrorism throughout our continent. Many things have already been done, our cooperation is exemplary, but we will continue to strengthen this cooperation in action at every moment.

Finally, I would like to remind you that the government is fully engaged in the fight against terrorism. As early as last week, I held a defense council after the first council of ministers so that all the different situations are followed.

Tomorrow we will hold a new Defense Council which will make it possible to advance on the establishment of an anti-Daesh (Anti ISIS) task force, on the greater coordination of our intelligence services and the strengthening of the means that are already deployed. Believe me, that beyond this sense of solidarity, France's has to willing to go even further in European cooperation and France's will to go even further in the security and protection of all of our nationals. What happened yesterday in Manchester has again shown us that terrorists have a target, the free world, youth and that we all have a deep common destiny in this matter. Thank you.
