

INDIA GUEST OF HONOUR IN THE 14th OF JULY ACQUIRES 26 RAFALE JETS & 3 SUBMARINES

PARTICIPATE TO FRENCH MILITARY PARADE

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USPA NEWS - The President of the French Republic, Emmanuel Macron welcomed in Paris the Indian Prime Minister, Mr. Narendra Modi, guest of honor at the parade on July 14, 2023. This invitation marks the celebration of the 25th anniversary of the strategic partnership that binds the two countries. As soon as he landed in Paris PM Modi tweeted "I thank President @EmmanuelMacron and Mrs. Macron for hosting me at the Élysée Palace this evening,"

Alongside the French President Macron, Prime Minister Modi thus attended the 14th of July parade during which 3 Indian guests and around 240 soldiers from the Indian armed forces marched. "Finally, you know how much importance I give to the dialogue between our cultures, which nourishes the grand narrative of our common history. This is a point that we will discuss in detail this evening at the Louvre, with the ambition of sharing our museum expertise with India, of highlighting the exceptional Indian heritage in all its diversity, including religious, but also of multiplying cooperation, whether in music, dance, cinema."

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Among the numerous other announcements, PM Modi unveiled the opening of a new Indian consulate in Marseille in France, "the deepening of the relations between the two countries, economic strengthening new initiatives to increase the relationship of new energy green energy, semiconductors, cyber tech and thermal retentions and we will launch YUPI I, a payment platform of India and the establishment of ecosystems" We publish, in the following the Joint statement, full text as it was delivered by the French Presidency.

The Indian Prime Minister Modi also said he has been to the France many times (President Macron also recalled his visit in India in 2018, which he remembered joyfully), except that this 2023's visit, is one of a kind, as he pointed its support to India and the strength of ties between the two countries, which mark the 25th anniversary of their strategic partnership. "It is a giant in the history of the world that will have a determining role in our future," he declared. He also highlighted the bilateral exchanging of best expertises from both sides, to enhance the attractiveness, including from the cultural perspective, when it comes to museology...ahead of his gala dinner to be held in his honour at the prestigious Le Louvre, Museum. Not to mention that during the massive military french Parade at Champs Elysee, Indian troops marched and three French-made Indian Rafale jets did a fly-by. The spectacular parade showcased the weapons and military officers marching, before the two heads of state, alongside with the first lady, Brigitte Macron, French Preside of the senate, Gerard Larcher, And of French National Assembly Macron, and the french PM Elisabeth Borne, with Modi at his side, will preside over Friday's grandiose annual military parade to mark France's national day.

PRES MACRON & INDIAN PM ARE ON THE SAME PAGE FOR MAINTAINING SUSTAINABLE PEACE IN INDOPACIFIC REGION

During the Joint Declaration made by French President Macron and Indian Prime Minister, at Elysee Palace, Narendra Modi, also insisted on his side, on the aspect of geopolitical partnership, joining the words of his French counterpart on the importance of the role of France, allied with India, for the "maintenance of a lasting peace in the Indo zone. Peaceful". This is thus announced a few days before President Macron's next trip, which will go to the Indo Pacific zone represented by 1.5 million French citizens. (By the end of next week) among others in New Caledonia.

"As the sovereignty of the Indo Pacific, it is the responsibility of India and France to ensure peace and stability in this region and we are working on a roadmap in the Indo-Pacific to make our participations fruitful and graceful. to the triangular fund for the development of the indo pacific and to create an opportunity for start-ups and thank you to France for leading our research of the oceanographic world and biodiversity in the pacific", declared the Indian Prime Minister Modi

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
